President's Corner

Our September luncheon was well attended with twenty-one in attendance. Our speaker was Mr. Jake Clark, founder and president of Save A Warrior Foundation. Following the events of 9/11 he reenlisted in the Guard, completed Officer Candidate School, and served multiple peacekeeping tours to the former Yugoslavia where he witnessed the aftermath of genocidal atrocities, greatly impacting his worldview. While an MBA student at Pepperdine University, he interrupted his studies to found Save A Warrior in 2012 in Malibu, California. Jake's novel and disruptive



approach in the areas of reintegration and PTS-related suicide prevention, inspired the creation and informs the curriculums of several derivative resiliency programs across the country and abroad.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to thank two anonymous donors for their contributions to the Foundation. These contributions and others like them help to make possible the Chapter's annual ROTC scholarship awards and our support for our remote service members. One ROTC professor told me that the scholarship awarded to one of his students would help him stay in school after the student's Government scholarship was withdrawn due to lack of funding. The contributions you make to the Foundation do make a difference!

The Chapter continues to shrink. Please, if you know of an eligible retiree, see if they will join the chapter. Membership numbers are critical to helping us to maintain the Federal and state benefits we have earned—and that's a continuing fight because the money is allocated annually in the Federal and state budgets.

As always, if you have any suggestions on how we can do this better, please let me know. We value your input for the betterment of the Chapter. Thank you for your time.

Legislative News


MOAA continues to advocate for active duty, reserve, and retired service members and their dependents. Click <u>this link</u> to learn more about MOAA's advocacy. MOAA's priorities in Congress include:

- Combat-injured veterans lose a dollar of earned DoD retirement pay for every
 dollar of VA disability compensation, and the Major Richard Star Act would end
 that unjust financial offset. Use this link to urge your legislators to support the
 Star Act. In addition, amendments with the language of the Star Act are being
 considered in both legislative chambers.
- Administrative red tape and access delays continue to burden military families seeking routine and prenatal care. MOAA supports two bipartisan bills designed to streamline care delivery, reduce lost duty time, and ensure continuity during critical life events. Add your voice here.

Writing takes about two minutes. Either click one of the links above, or from the "Active Legislative Campaigns" page, click on the "Write" button to the right of the title and description of each bill. Fill out your personal information and then click the "Submit" button at the bottom of the page. (You can edit MOAA's recommended wording if you want, but most legislators count their "issue mail" instead of reading it.—Ed.)

You can find the bills MOAA supports on the "MOAA-Supported Legislation" page here: MOAA Action Center This is a great list if you're interested in learning more about the bills. You can click on the name of the bill and learn more about it.

When you fill out the "Act now!" information, the last item asks you to indicate your MOAA Chapter. When you see the "SELECT" prompt, scroll down or type "OH02" to get the Central Ohio Chapter.

Last week, AFROTC and Army ROTC cadets at Ohio University honored the heroes of September 11th by participating in the 9/11 Stair Climb Challenge (left). The challenge was to climb the equivalent of 110 stories (~2,200 steps) of the World Trade Center that our heroes had to climb on 9/11. Each step represents the courage, sacrifice, and resilience of the first responders, service members, and civilians who made the ultimate sacrifice.

At Ohio State University, the Buckeye Battalion also honored the lives lost in the attacks of September 11, 2001 (right). They were accompanied by OSU's Naval and Air Force ROTC programs, athletic teams, and civilian organizations, with more than 1,400 individuals coming together to pay tribute.
